"Luke has such a positive attitude at school. He comes in daily smiling from ear to ear," says his teacher Miss Kayla. "He is so willing to participate and learn new things. He knows how to make you laugh and smile even when you are having a bad day. He has brought such a positive, irreplaceable energy to the classroom." And Luke's speech therapist at Elim, Brandi, adds that Luke's family thrives on his many successes and they are extremely grateful for the opportunities Luke has at Elim to connect and engage with his staff and peers.

Brandi also describes Luke as social, good-natured, funny, inquisitive, kind, caring, and strong. These are just some of his strengths. He also thrives on social interaction, learning, and pleasing others, and he enjoys engaging in curricular, therapeutic, and social activities throughout each school day.

A ROLE-MODEL AND FRIEND

Even with his outgoing personality, Luke hadn't always been so open. When he first joined Elim, it took him a while to open up to his staff and classmates. He had a hard time handling the transition and was not immediately able to adjust to his new classroom.

But in no time, thanks to the care and attention of Elim staff, he has made connections, friendships, and has even become a fantastic role model for other students.

Brandi admires how Luke rises above the tough times in life.



"Luke may show frustration and fear with change, but he works through these changes with strength and humility, wanting to accept and meet any given expectation," she says. Last summer, when Luke made a second transition to a new room, she was happy to report he handled it much better thanks to the growth he has had at Elim.

Miss Kayla has seen the pay offs of the work Luke has done with Miss Brandi as they continue to work together to find the right communication tool for him. "His communication has blossomed," she shares. "Luke has made many on-topic comments about what is going on in class or about a discussion we are having.." She can't wait to see how Luke continues to improve his communication and becomes even better equipped to advocate for himself.

From going to see movies, to working with HOPE Packs, Adam has experiences every day that he might not receive somewhere else.

Adam has been given the nickname "supervisor Adam" because he is always looking out for the other program participants. When out in the community, Adam stays toward the back of the group. Why? Because he can make sure that everyone stays with the group! Even at the end of the day, Adam makes sure everyone on his bus route has made it onto the bus before they head home.

I wasn't sure how he would react or if it would be too much stimulation for him," remembers Polly. "Since he's started going on community outings with Elim, though, he has become my grocery shopping partner!"

### **PURSUIT OF POSSIBILITY**

Happy New Year! If you, like me, took some time early in the New Year to assess and re-envision the possibilities God has before us, then you will find the "Pursue Possibilities" theme of this issue of the *Equip* particularly appropriate. The stories of Luke and Adam are testimonies of how God is at work making possible what often seems impossible.

In Mathew 19 Jesus spoke candidly about possibilities so difficult they seemed impossible. **But with God all things are possible** (Matthew 19:26). This issue of the Equip is a testimony to that.

We all have limitations, and these limits can seem even more apparent for the children and adults who come to Elim. And because one of our human limitations is faith and belief in God's ability to use all people, it can be more challenging for us to envision what is really possible for people with disabilities.

# But because God is involved, there is possibility even when it all seems impossible.

At Elim, we refer to this as "God-given potential."

So as you read through the stories of Luke, Adam, and the extended impact you make happen, take note of the pursuit of more obvious possibilities like cognitive, physical, sensory and behavioral progress. These pursuits are entirely noteworthy and cause for thanks and celebration! But notice also the less obvious possibilities that are being pursued. These less obvious possibilities exist at more of a soul level as God uses Elim to grow the fruits of the Spirit (Galatians 5:22-23) into circumstances where the obvious possibilities seem more elusive.

God is at work in each "pursuit of possibility" at Elim, and I give thanks to God for your partnership in those pursuits!
