### THRIVING, THANKS TO YOU!

In class, Ryan and his peers work together to follow a recipe they pick out each week. After Ryan passes the recipe out to the group, they begin the steps, one by one. Ryan readily volunteers for steps like putting the pan in the oven or measuring out ingredients into the bowl.

For Ryan, participating in this group instruction is a big indicator of his growth over the last few years. Though very social, Ryan had trouble being around peers or staff who he did not already favor. When Jessica began working with him three years ago, she noted that he was not yet equipped to handle those frustrating situations successfully. But today she shares that his progress has been incredible.

Now, Ryan is doing a great job of communicating, "I need a break," when he finds himself in un-preferred situations. By practicing self-advocacy, he is becoming more comfortable in group situations – a huge win that he continues to build on.

### AN ADMIRED FRIEND

Lauren shares that Ryan is a joy to have in class. He loves to dance and create artwork in recreational therapy. Ryan has a fondness for inside jokes and loves to laugh, so much so that Lauren often can't help but laugh along with him. He is also a great athlete, with one of the fastest mile runs (13 minutes!) in the Pathways group.

"Ryan is so charming. He has a magnetic smile and energy, and he is very intelligent," Lauren gushes.

#### A TEAM OF SUPPORT

No matter what goal he is working toward, Ryan knows that at Elim he has a supportive team helping him each step of the way. Each staff member on his team works hard to help equip him with the skills he needs to thrive.

Each week, Ryan works to find productive ways to manage his frustrations. He practices communicating his wants and needs with Elim staff. He gains prevocational skills when he ventures out on a community-based outing, and he's learning daily living skills with Jessica at his side.

Jessica shares, "Ryan is one to really want to try new things on his own, and he never stops surprising me with what he does. From my perspective, I can't ask for anything more than being independent. I am really proud of him!"

ELIM PARTNERS WITH FELLOW EDUCATORS TO PROMOTE POSITIVE AND SUCCESSFUL LEARNING

Focusing on social emotional learning (SEL) helps each student develop the skills they need to manage their emotions, build positive relationships with others, make responsible decisions, and engage in learning. This year, Southwest Chicago Christian Schools (of Oak Lawn and Tinley Park, Illinois) reached out for Elim's expertise to help enhance their SEL programming.

Allie Szczecinski, an education consultant in Elim's Learning program, kicked off the school year with a two-hour professional development presentation for the teachers and staff at Southwest Chicago Christian Schools. She focused on social emotional learning, community building, and the importance of consequences being logical. One elementary teacher in attendance shared that "we gained a connection between student learning, effective management, and positive community practices." Allie's presentation led into year-long partnerships with both campuses. Allie's coaching is equipping the teachers and staff with a toolbox full of tools to integrate social emotional learning across the school day!
